

Mayor Krump called the Board of Equalization meeting to order at 5:00 p.m., April 6, 2026, at Hankinson Community Center. Council members present Bladow, Falk, Roeder, and Anderson; Melissa Brown and Wendy Matejcek, Richland County Assessor's Office. Steffens and Post were absent.

No oral or written comments/complaints were received prior to the Board of Equalization meeting at City Hall.

Mayor Krump turned the meeting over to Matejcek.

She reviewed the 2026 Hankinson Assessor's Report, along with overall changes in real estate assessments in the city. She then reviewed the mobile home listing, a breakdown of Homestead Credit applications, and the Disabled Veterans' Credits.

Motion by Falk/Bladow to approve the mobile home listing showing three mobile homes in mobile home parks and two mobile homes on private property. Carried.

Motion by Anderson/Falk to approve the Homestead Credit applications for senior citizens and disabled persons with a total of 36 applications received, broken down as follows: Twenty-One at 100% and Ten at 50%. Carried.

Bladow/Anderson made a motion to approve the Disabled Veteran's Credit applications, as presented. Sixteen Veteran's applications were received and broken down as follows: Eight at 100%, Two at 90%, Four at 70%, One at 60% and One at 50%. Carried.

Motion by Falk/Anderson to approve the 2026 Assessor's report, pending communication about reassessments requested by residents attending this meeting. Carried.
